William (Bill) Wright AM had an international career as educator, curator, writer, gallery director and artist. Lecturing and exhibiting in UK, USA and Australia, holding senior positions including Head of Painting, Winchester School of Art, UK, Associate Dean of the New York Studio School, NY, Dean of Visual Art at the State University of New York, Purchase, Assistant Director (Professional) Art Gallery of New South Wales 1982-91, Director, Sherman Galleries, Sydney 1992 -2005. Curated The 4th Biennale of Sydney,(1982), The British Show (1985, co-curator Anthony Bond), N.Z.11 (1988), Mayakovsky: 20 Years of Work (1987), Systems End: Contemporary Art in Australia (1996) and Rose Crossing (1999). appointed a Member of the Order of Australia for his service to the visual arts. In 2016 a survey of Wrights artistic practice 1965 -2014 was held posthumously at the National Art School where he had studied and taught.
